MAHATMA GANDHI

Mohandas Karamchand Gandhi, called Mahatma, is the father of our nation. He was born on 2 October 1869 at Porbandar in Gujarat. His birthday on 2nd October is observed worldwide as the international day of non-violence. He belonged to a well-to-do family, his father being attached to the royal court of Rajkot. He was not quite good at studies but he took great care of his character.

His father Karamchand Uttamchand Gandhi was Chief Minister of Porbandar. Hanilal, Manilal, Ramdas, and Devdas were Gandhi's four sons. Mahatma Gandhi was one of the great leaders of the Indian Independence movement against British rule. Gandhiji inspired civil rights and freedom movements across the world.

Mohandas Karamchand Gandhi or Mahatma Gandhi was an Indian lawyer, active politician, and freedom fighter. He was the greatest freedom fighter who has proved to the world that

Satyagrah. He fought for social reforms, economic reforms and justice, and fair and equitable treatment. He taught the Indians the lessons of truthfulness, love, cooperation, fearlessness, and cleanliness. He started a weekly, Indian opinion in 1904.

* Contributions of Mahatma Gandhi:

Gandhiji experimented with the weapon Satyagrah for the first time in South Africa in September 1906 to protest against the Asiatic Ordinance issued against the Indian in Transvaal. Gandhiji's first imprisonment was in 1908 at Johannesburg in South Africa.

In 1899 during the Boer War, Gandhiji organized Indian Ambulance Corps for the British. He was humiliated and ousted from Peter Maritzburg Railway Station in South Africa. He started Tolstoy Farm in South Africa in 1910 and Phoenix Settlement in Durban.

Mahatma Gandhi was greatly influenced in his ideas such as Satyagrah, civil disobedience, and passive resistance by the great Russian philosopher and writer Leo Tolstoy. He had gained a lot of experience in South Africa and when

he returned to India in 1915, he was fully equipped for the job he was to undertake. January 9 is observed as "Pravasi Bharatiya Diwas" to commemorate this.

At that time there was a great influence of Gopal Krishna Gokhale and Bal Gangadhar Tilak on Indian politics. Mahatma Gandhi was influenced by both, though he actually evolved his own ideology and strategy. Still, his real mentor was Gopal Krishna Gokhale. Whole he is said to have given the title "Mahatma" which actually stuck to his own name instead of that of his mentor. Mahatma Gandhi was greatly influenced by Indian epics the Ramayana and the Mahabharata, and loved to read the Gita, an English translation of which had actually changed his life.

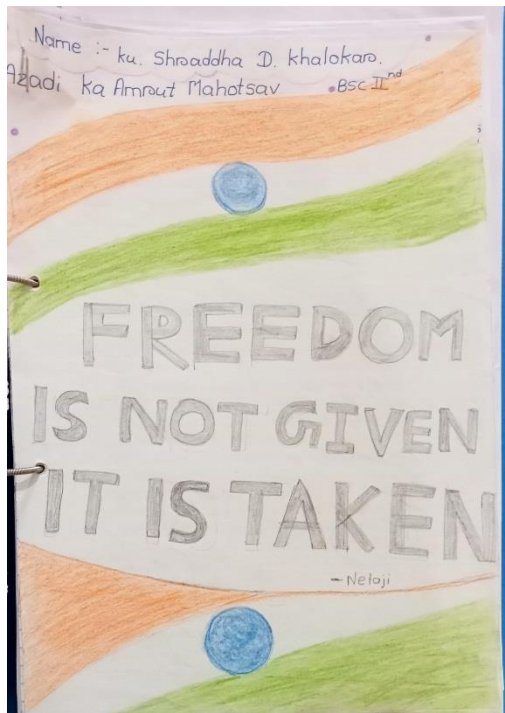
Reforms of Mahatma Gandhi: Apart from being a politician, Gandhiji did many works as a social reformer to end casteism, untouchability, drug abuse, polygamy, the purdah system, and communal discrimination. He was in favor of Hindu-Muslim unity throughout his life, but after getting independence, he could not maintain this unity. When the talk of partition of India started in the name of religion, he was very sad.

the greatest of battles could be fought and won by applying peaceful methods.

Education of Mahatma Gandhi: At the age of 14, he married Kasturba Gandhi. Later he went to England to study law. The traditional Brahmins created a lot of hindrances in his way as he considered crossing the seas to be against the religious tenets. In England, Gandhiji found great difficulty in getting vegetarian food, but at last, he was able to locate a restaurant that served such food.

Mahatma Gandhi did law in England and returned to India as a barrister in 1891. He started practice at Rajkot and Bombay but failed. He was a young man of shy nature and it is said that when he appeared before the judge for the first time in order to plead for a case, he could not utter a single word.

Mahatma Gandhi went to South Africa in 1893 in connection with a case. There he was the miserable condition of the Indians and other black people. He set up there Phoenix Ashram and formed the Natal Indian Congress in 1896. He opposed the white African policy of apartheid tooth and nail and had his first experience of the practice of



This slogan raised the momentum of the heartbeat of millions of revolutionaries. "Give me blood, I shall give you freedom" who were seeking freedom. Even today, this slogan reminds us of this great personality - Subhash Chandra Bose. Netaji infused courage and confidence in the hearts of freedom fighters. His army, named as Indian National Army (INA), was a startling example of Netaji's superior warcraft and able leadership qualities.

His intrepid patriotism made him a hero in India. He is considered to be a prominent Indian revolutionary in the independence movement against British rule of India during World War II. He also led an Indian national force from abroad against the Western powers during.

The list of freedom fighters of India is deserted without the name of Subhash Chandra Bose. Even though each one of them was equally important, he possesses a unique personality. Whatever he did for the country can not be paid off. He was such a great patriot in the true sense.

became a law graduate and later traveled to England to become a barrister. After returning to India he continued practicing law in Ahmedabad, Gujarat.

A meeting with MK Gandhi in October 1917 brought him closer to the Indian Independence movement. He joined Indian National Congress and his initial movements started with satyagraha in Gujarat against British atrocities. Later he actively participated and volunteered the Quit India movement in 1942, closely working with Gandhiji. Patel had a very strong contribution in uniting the people of India during India's freedom movements.

During this time, he was jailed many times. The feeling of patriotism and urge to expel British from Indian Territory became his first and only objective.

His life has been an inspiring and motivating one. Firstly, he achieved his professional goals with very little support from others and thereafter playing a major decisive role in bringing the people of India together to fight for the nation's independence.

His belief in the principle of unity in Diversity and stand united for the

Bose's selfless contribution to India's independence movement and organizing and leading the Indian National Army is indispensable. Netaji infused courage and confidence in the heart of freedom fighters. He was a great leader of India. His countrymen called him 'Netaji' because he led them on the right path despite the difficulties like being in prison, he showed the correct path to everyone.

Subhash Chandra Bose was a strong believer in Bhagwat Gita. It was his belief that Bhagwat Gita was a great source of inspiration for the fight against the British.

Subhash Chandra Bose was a man of strong will power who greatly contributed to Indian independence. He believed that not with the non-violence but India can get independence by a fight with the British government. He visited various countries to ally with them to fight the British government with alliance of the Japanese army, 'Azad Hind Fauz' won many battles against Britishers. Netaji went to jail many times due to his nationalist approach. Subhash Chandra Bose also started Azad Hind Rato in Germany to lead its independence movement on a global platform.






