The poem The Quest exemplifies the modern way of searching for the ultimate answer. The soul has to pass through 84, 00,000 births before it can attain salvation. The medium of search can change but not the ultimate answer.

In the poem The Excuse the poet gives a powerful expression to the feeling of failure which is recurrent in the life of people in recent time. The business and a routine schedule in doing so many things everyday keeps the poet extremely busy but it sometimes makes her feel suffocated too:

Routine in modern life has become so that it neither gives satisfaction of a productive and fruitful life nor it allows some respite to breathe freely. The business in the routine life smothers and the modern man uses it as an excuse to hide his/her failure. The poet says that 'My Routine' is a consolation against the feeling of failure for not being able to transcend the boundaries between less time and timelessness from doing nothing to nothingness. 'The Excuse' the



most appropriate reflection of vacuum in the life of a modern man.

Inaction in routine life pinches the heart of the poet and she gets disturbed by qualms of conscience that prick her over passing time of life and her inability to perform something substantial which could be the ultimate goal of life. Whenever someone asks: What's up?' She gets nervous over her own reply 'nothing much'. Dr Vyas strikingly voices the frustrated mindset of people in present times for neither having respite, nor having work satisfaction and contentment in her poem Inaction. Something is always missing in spite of having everything. Days in life pass without any contentment at heart.

Parting is another poem in DL which closely reflects the life of modern people, their hectic schedule, chronic health issues as a result and untimely final parting from the world with heavy heart with so many things unsaid. The poet says:

Heart....??? When did I listen to it last? With every beat, it repeats, its own tender wishes, its own priorities!

But, this monotonous maze, makes me miss, its stifled appeals....!

I Procrastinate...I Postpone...! The deferment continues....

Tiptoeing pass the moments, Unbidden falls the twilight....!
